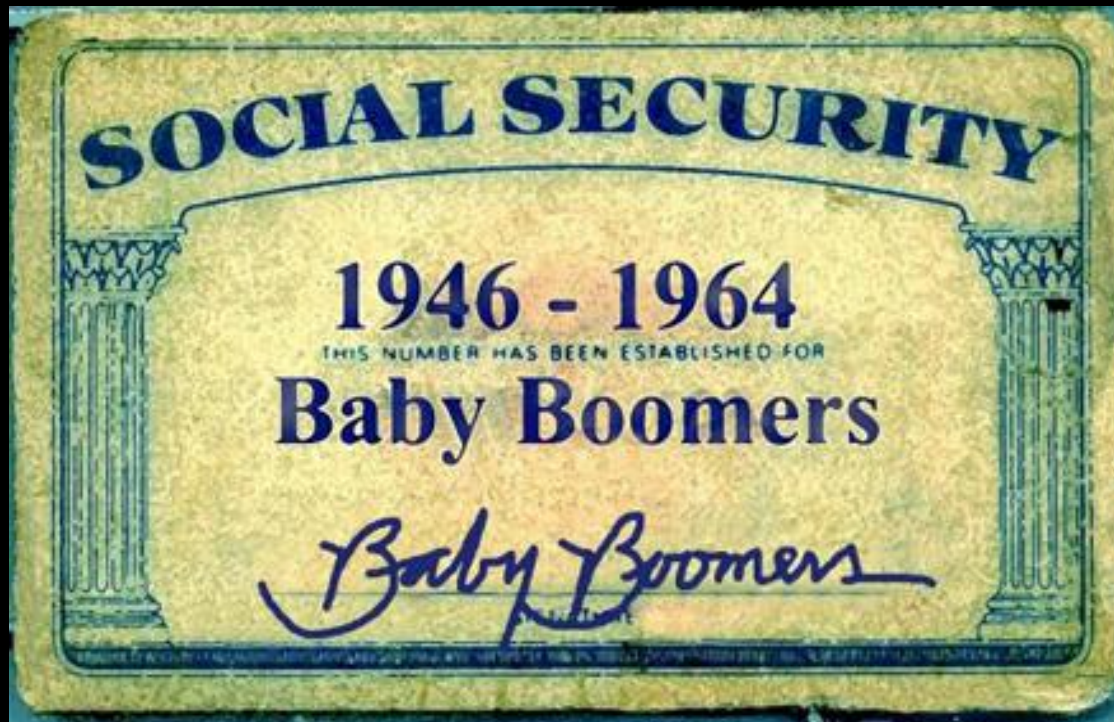

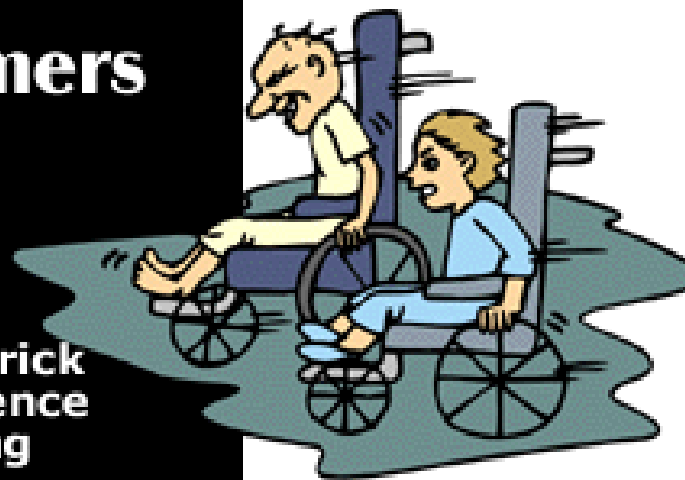

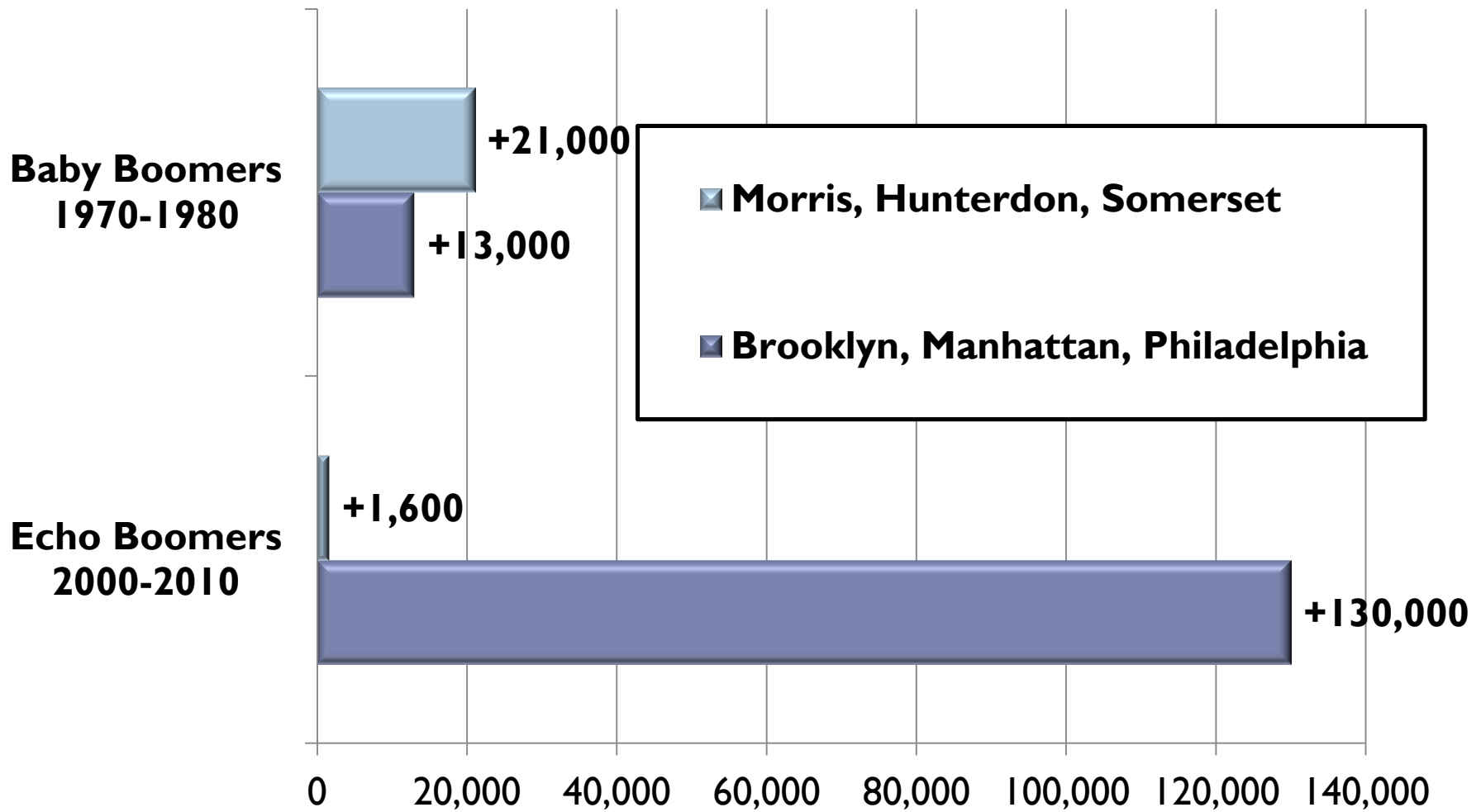
Echo-Boomers or After-Boomers
